




# Senior Community Awards

June 3, 2019

- HARRIET FELDMAN was a remarkable woman who felt that there was nothing more important than her family and her involvement in the education of ALL the children of Roslyn. Harriet's focus went far beyond our honor students who generally garner many awards. She had been an early childhood educator and her philosophy was to reach out to all students and make every effort to meet their varying needs. Mrs. Feldman demonstrated a commitment to the achievement of all of Roslyn's students by serving as President of the PTA's in the schools that her four children attended, and as a member and Co-President of CCPA, our Coordinating Council of Parent Associations. She cherished the accomplishments of every Roslyn youngster and devoted herself to helping all children reach their fullest potential. Mrs. Feldman was elected to the Roslyn Board of Education in 1985, and served a total of six and one-half years; two as Vice-President and the last two as President, despite a serious illness. A scholarship fund was established in her loving memory. In the spirit of her tireless devotion to the success of every student, the Harriet Feldman Achievement Award is given each year to a high school graduate who has shown dedicated and continuous advancement.
- GEORGE E. BRYANT was the superintendent of schools in Roslyn from 1943 to 1963. He began his career in Roslyn in 1929 as a mathematics teacher at the high school and junior high school levels. As superintendent, during the years following World War II, George Bryant guided the school district through the time of its greatest expansion. The East Hills School, Harbor Hill School and Roslyn Junior High School (now the Middle School) were built during his administration. Most important, he led our schools through a dramatic transition from a small school district to a much larger one in which higher education became a goal for the vast majority of youngsters. Mr. Bryant is remembered for his love of children and the great respect and sympathy he showed towards everyone in the community. Not only did he himself display creative leadership in overseeing the school district during a complex period, he also nurtured the creativity of the teaching staff. He was a firm believer in the concept that there is no single, correct approach to learning, and encouraged teachers to be open to new ideas and apply them creatively in the classroom. The George E. Bryant Creativity Award is presented to a student who has demonstrated an outstanding creative spirit during his or her high school career.

- NANCY GOLDMAN dedicated herself to improving the lives and wellbeing of people in our community for over twenty years. Even while facing her own health battles for the last thirteen years, Nancy found the time to volunteer for multiple positions within the Roslyn School District, and be an uplifting spirit to all those with whom she interacted. Nancy served as a PTA President & Treasurer, as well as President of the Roslyn High School Marching Band Fans. She served on multiple School Board and Senior Party Art committees, and organized and actively participated in fund raising events. She was well known by teachers, administrators, parents, and students as someone who deeply cared about their wellbeing; someone who consistently went out of her way to try and help others. She refused to let illness define her. Until the very end, she somehow managed to greet everyone with a big friendly smile. Nancy had the ability to see and bring out the best in people.
- MARVIN ERGER was known as a man who confronted adversity and not only survived, but went beyond it to prosper. Mr. Erger came to this country after he was liberated from a concentration camp with no possessions, no friends, no family in America and no fluency in English. He overcame all obstacles to become a respected businessman and beloved friend of the Roslyn community. His delicatessen, Andel's, is still frequented by Roslyn students with whom he had a close relationship. For this reason, with fondness for Roslyn schoolchildren, the Marvin Erger Memorial Scholarship has been established.
- STEWART HECHT KINDMAN is honored by the Roslyn community as an outstanding student who persevered with a healthy spirit after developing osteogenic sarcoma while in the Roslyn Junior High. Although Stewart missed many weeks of school while undergoing cancer treatments, he remained an excellent student, a member of the Roslyn Chapter of the National Honor Society, a National Merit semi-finalist. He was co-recipient of the first William Alexander Memorial Award, received the Bruce Cutler Memorial award in 1987 and was flag bearer that year. Stewart learned to understand quality of life. In his college essay, he wrote: "While in the hospital, changes began to take place in me. I met incredible people who were much sicker than I was and still had a positive outlook... I was shocked into a realization of what is really important in life... I found an inner strength that I had never before needed."Those who knew Stewart said "His warmth and humor in the face of his illness were a true measure of his courage and dignity" and "Stewart found happiness in every single day and took advantage of it;" "His illness was not the focus of his life." In this spirit the honor of a memorial award in his name is bestowed.

Her passion was to help people, and she enjoyed being a positive influence in the lives of her students. She gave unselfishly of her time and her door was always open. She taught us all the importance of treating one another with kindness and acceptance. She truly led by example. Her spirit lives on in the many lives she has touched.
- EMPRESS ALASIA PRESTON was a beloved member of the Roslyn community and an active member of the student body. Her friends valued her radiant smile and generous heart. In addition to being an aspiring student, on campus Empress was a member of the school chorus, girls' varsity track team and the bowling team. Like many teens her age, she loved hanging out with her friends, listening to music, taking pictures and snap chatting. According to many, she was fearless, would be there if you needed her to be, and always made people around her feel they mattered. Her untimely death at age 16 will forever leave a void in our hearts. Her spirit will remain in our hearts forever.

- The JODI GOLDEN Community Service Awards were established in 2018 by the North Shore Autism Circle and members of the Roslyn community. Jodi served as Co- President of the Roslyn SEPTA and was instrumental in creating children's programs and other events at The Park at East Hills. Jodi was passionate about and devoted to community service. Jodi organized many Autism initiatives as well as fundraisers for Canine Companions, causes near and dear to her heart.
- LAURA ADLER spent her life as an advocate for her special education students, a mentor to her colleagues, an inspiration to her friends and loved ones and a loving guide to her husband and children. Over her more than 20 years at Roslyn, Laura approached challenges with unyielding passion and perfectionism, whether she was planning a class lesson, counseling a student, or developing an event for the Roslyn Teacher Center, which she co-directed. Laura's life was full and noble and blessed; she had the gift of helping countless Roslyn students realize their potential. Laura, a voracious reader and writer, believed that individuals have limitless options in life, and that education keeps those options open. The scholarship founded in her memory will be awarded annually to a student who has shown continued academic improvement and who exemplifies the credo that she articulated and lived by: "Determination is key. Compassion is vital. A smile gets you through."
- ERICKA BISHOP, a 1993 graduate of Roslyn High School, was an outstanding student and an outstanding young woman. She stood in two very different worlds and gave us all great insights into those cultural and racial differences. After her two years at Yale University, she decided to become a teacher. The intensity of her breadth and scope of knowledge and how much more she wanted to learn left an indelible imprint on those who knew her. Her artistic talent and her incredible skill in writing were second to none. She had so much to give; she enriched all of us who knew her. Our world of academia, the family and friends who loved her, and the people she would have touched are the victims of her needlessly tragic death.
