



American Sign Language Club: Come join the ASL club and learn to be "handy"! Students will be given the opportunity to learn a unique visual language that will allow them to interact with the Deaf Community. The students will learn about Deaf events around Long Island and possibly host their own Deaf event for the Deaf community right here in Roslyn. (Mondays, 129)

Chess and Strategic Board Games: Are you a board games enthusiast? Board games are fun and exciting and can require a good amount of strategy, thinking, and luck. The Chess and Strategic Games Club is a place where students can learn, teach, and play many different types of games with both old and new friends. Compare strategies with your peers while playing Chess, Checkers, Connect Four, Battleship, Othello, Mancala, and more! Each week, students will be able to test their skills on a new game and help others learn the ropes. The rules are simple, but the strategies are endless. Students with all levels of experience are welcome to join! (Wednesdays, 104)

Chorale: Chorale is an auditioned choir, open to 7th and 8th graders. The group performs at school functions, seasonal school concerts, and other events. The repertoire is advanced, and knowing how to read music is required. Auditions are at the end of May/early June each year for the following year. Rehearsals are before school at 7am all year. (Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, 125.)

Community Service Club: The community service club will provide students with extraordinary opportunities to become active members of their community. The goal of this club is to instill citizenship within the students of Roslyn Middle School. Activities of the club will include various fundraising and outreach projects. Drama Club/ Spotlight: Do you love to act, sing and dance? Or maybe you're interested in the technical aspects of theater such as sound, lighting and set design. The RMS *Spotlight* Drama Club will provide it all! *Spotlight* produces one full-scale Broadway musical each school year and is open to all sixth, seventh and eighth grade students. Auditions for parts take place in the fall, and everyone who tries out for the show will have an opportunity to participate. Rehearsals take place after school Mondays, Wednesday, and Thursdays, *depending on scenes and characters*. Showtime is early February, 2018. Instrumental Music Club: Select Instrumental Music Club is a performance group composed of students registered in Orchestra. Also referred to as the String Ensemble, this group performs at the concerts and at various extra performances both in and outside school throughout the year. (Mondays, 123)

Jazz Band: The Jazz Band is a club open to woodwind, brass, and rhythm section players who would like to experience different genres of jazz music (big band, Latin jazz, jazz-rock etc.). Instruments include: flute, oboe, clarinet, all saxophones, trumpet, French horn, trombone, baritone horn, tuba, guitar, piano, bass and drum set. The club welcomes students in sixth, seventh and eighth grades who have an interest in Science, Math, Technology, and Engineering. A major part of the Science Olympiad Club will be spent preparing for the Science Olympiad Regional Competition. Students will be working in small teams to prepare for up to three events of their choice. For the Science Olympiad, students conduct research about their event(s) and some groups are required to build a project and test it. The ultimate goal of the club is to win the Regional Science Olympiad competition and move on to the State level competition.
