Board President's Comments -

Ms. Ben-Levy recognized the beautiful art work on display in the Board Room from the Heights School.

She then commented on Yom HaShoah - Holocaust Remembrance Day. She stated "we talk about social and emotional learning and relational aggression. And when you think about some of the events that have taken place in our world decades ago and some events taking place in our world today in other places, it is to be noted there is no place for lack of human respect and for the understanding of similarities and differences and the connections made between people. As Educators and those who love education it is our solemn responsibility to appreciate good citizenship and to enhance and encourage it everywhere we can, as often as we can, for as long as we can."

Superintendent's Comments –

Mr. Dempsey announced the following:

- May 17th is the next Board of Education meeting as well as budget vote and election of returning board members. The hours are 7am to 9pm in the Roslyn High School auditorium. After the votes are counted, the Board will go into public session to accept the results of the voting. There may also be a brief business meeting since the next board meeting is not scheduled until June 16th.
- On May 11th, 2016, the Third Precinct of the Nassau County Police
 Department will be holding a community meeting to introduce the Problem
 Orientated Policing Unit. He stated the Third Precinct police has been
 very supportive of the District.
- On May 25th, Dr. Stephen Dewey will present <u>The Effects of Drugs on the Fragile Teenage Brain</u>. On May 20th he will be speaking to the 8th graders

at the Middle School. Parents of adolescence are invited to bring their children with them to the presentation.

Ms. Ben-Levy commented that there is a petition being circulated to seek to reopen the Nassau County Police Department - 6th Precinct.

Mr. Seinfeld remarked that Dr. Stephen Dewey is one of the best speakers he has ever seen present on this topic.
