- **B.4.** Recommendation to approve a payment in the amount of \$32,024.41 to Ingerman Smith, L.L.P. for legal services rendered to the district for the period ending 6/30/2022.
- **B.5.** Recommendation to adopt the following resolution with respect to the setting of the School District Tax Levy for the 2022-2023 school year:

RESOLVED, the budget of the necessary claims and expenditures in the Roslyn Union Free School District in the Towns of North Hempstead and Oyster Bay for the school year 2022-23 amounting to \$122,145,193 for "School Purposes" and \$5,093,169 for "Library Purposes" totaling \$127,238,362 is hereby accepted, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has estimated the revenue from all other sources including State Aid to be \$20,996,518; and

WHEREAS, the Library Board of Trustees has estimated the revenue from all other sources for 2022-23 to be **\$28,800**;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the sums of \$101,148,675 for "School Purposes" and \$5,064,369 for "Library Purposes" totaling \$106,213,044 being the remainder of the budget adopted as above and the net amount which must be raised by taxation for the Roslyn Union Free School District, be levied upon the taxable property of said school district as said property has been certified to the Nassau County Board of Assessors for the school year 2022-23.

RESOLVED, that the District Clerk of this School District is hereby authorized and directed, pursuant to Section 6-20.0 and amendments thereto of the Nassau County Administrative Code, to file a certified copy of these resolutions with the Nassau County Legislature and the Department of Assessment, Mineola, New York, on or before August 15, 2022.

B.6. WHEREAS, the District participates in the National School Lunch Program and currently charges \$2.00 for elementary and secondary paid breakfast; \$3.00 for elementary paid lunch; and \$3.25 for secondary paid lunch;

WHEREAS, the Federal regulations at 7 CFR 210.14(e) require school districts participating in the National School Lunch Program to ensure sufficient funds are provided to the nonprofit school food service account for meals served to students who are not eligible for free or reduced priced meals;

WHEREAS, the District completed the paid lunch price calculation using the Price Lunch Equity (PLE) tool for the 2022-2023 school year;

WHEREAS, the calculation revealed that the District's school lunch prices do not meet the weighted average of paid school lunches; and

WHEREAS, an increase in the amount of \$0.25 is necessary in order to comply with the regulations.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education establishes the paid school lunch rates for the 2022-2023 school year as follows:

Elementary/Secondary Breakfast	\$2.25
Elementary Lunch	\$3.25
Secondary Lunch	\$3.50

- B.7. BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Roslyn Union Free School District hereby authorizes the School District to enter into Inter-Municipal Agreements for the 2022-2023 school year with the East Williston UFSD and Herricks UFSD in connection with Roslyn UFSD's Adult Education Program pursuant to General Municipal Law § 119-o subject to the terms and conditions of the agreements to be approved by District Counsel;
 - **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Education hereby authorizes the President of the Board of Education to execute the necessary documentation to effectuate said Agreements.
- **B.8.** Recommendation that the President of the Board of Education be authorized to execute the 2021-2022 Final AS-7 Contract with Nassau BOCES in the amount of \$4,042,794.82 in accordance with **Attachment B.8.**
- **B.9.** Recommendation that the President of the Board of Education be authorized to execute the 2022-2023 Initial AS-7 Contract with Nassau BOCES in the amount of \$3,537,978.67 in accordance with **Attachment B.9.**
- **B.10. BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Education hereby awards the Athletic Field Reconstruction at East Hills School to The LandTek Group, Inc. in the total base bid amount of \$748,800, which sum includes a Sitework Construction Allowance of \$25,000 for additional work required, together with Alternate 1 to the Base Bid in the amount of \$62,200 and Alternate 2 to the Base Bid in the amount of \$58,100; subject to the terms of an agreement to be prepared by District counsel;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education hereby authorizes the Board President to execute the necessary documents to effectuate said agreement between the District and The LandTek Group, Inc.
