#### NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING Volunteer Firefighters and Volunteer Ambulance Workers Exemption Roslyn Public Schools November 16, 2023, 6:00 p.m.

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that a public hearing will be held on November 16, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. prevailing time at the Roslyn Board of Education Boardroom located at 300 Harbor Hill Rd., Roslyn, NY 11576 at which time and place the Board of Education of the Roslyn Union Free School District will discuss adopting certain property tax exemptions for eligible **Volunteer Firefighters and Volunteer Ambulance Workers** pursuant to Section 466-a of the Real Property Tax Law.

The public hearing shall be held at the time and place stated herein.

Since there was no public comment, Ms. Ben-Levy closed the public hearing at 6:07 p.m.

## Board of Education Meeting immediately following public hearing

Ms. Ben-Levy moved, seconded by Mr. Levine carried by a vote of 5-0, (Messrs. Dubner and Minsky absent) to move and adopt agenda item BOE.1 out of order.

**BOE.1 WHEREAS,** the Board of Education of the Roslyn Union Free School District previously adopted a resolution on May 4, 2006, providing certain tax exemptions to volunteer firefighters and volunteer ambulance workers in accordance with amended Section 466-c of the New York State Real Property Tax Law, effective January 1, 2006; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Legislature has enacted legislation standardizing the real property tax exemption that all local governments, including school districts, may provide to volunteer firefighters and volunteer ambulance workers and repealing various sections of the Real Property Tax Law relating thereto, including former Section 466-c; and

WHEREAS, the new Section 466-a of the Real Property Tax Law, effective December 9, 2022, authorizes taxing jurisdictions, including school districts, to decrease the minimum service requirement for volunteer firefighters and volunteer ambulance workers to be eligible to receive the partial exemption from taxation from five years to two years; and

WHEREAS, subsequently, on March 28, 2023, Nassau County enacted Local Law 2-2023, which decreased the minimum service requirement for volunteer firefighters and volunteer ambulance workers to qualify for tax exemption; and WHEREAS, pursuant to the new Section 466-a, any school district that currently provides volunteer firefighters and volunteer ambulance workers with an exemption from taxation shall be authorized to continue to provide such exemption upon the adoption of a resolution conforming to the provisions of the new Section

466-a of the Real Property Tax Law no later than three years after such section takes effect; and

**WHEREAS,** in accordance with the requirements of Section 466-a of the Real Property Tax Law, the Roslyn Union Free School District Board of Education conducted a public hearing on November 16, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. for the purpose of discussing the proposed tax exemptions.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Roslyn Union Free School District, acting through the Board of Education, hereby approves the continuation and granting of a partial tax exemption from school tax as provided for by the new Section 466-a of the Real Property Tax Law to persons qualifying for such partial tax exemptions as follows:

- 1. Real property located within the Roslyn Union Free School District and owned by a volunteer member of an incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department and/or volunteer ambulance company shall be exempt from taxation to the extent of ten (10%) percent of the assessed valuation of such property so long as:
  - a. The applicant resides in the city, town or village which is served by such incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service;
  - b. The property is the primary residence of the application;
  - c. The property is used exclusively for residential purposes; provided however, that in the event any portion of such property is not used exclusively for the applicant's residence but is used for other purposes, such portion shall be subject to taxation and the remaining portion only shall be entitled to the exemption provided by this section; and
  - d. The applicant has been certified by the authority having jurisdiction for the incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department and/or volunteer ambulance company as an enrolled member of such incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department and/or volunteer ambulance company and that the applicant has been an enrolled member for no less than two years.
- 2. The application for the exemption afforded by this Resolution must be made to the Nassau County Department of Assessment and/or with the local assessor/clerk of a city or incorporated village on a form prescribed by the assessor. Each applicant must supply a letter of certification that includes the exact date enrolled and current active status on the letterhead of the incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department or voluntary ambulance service.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Education of the Roslyn Union Free School District is hereby authorized and directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Nassau County Department of Assessment on or before January 2, 2024.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this Resolution shall take effect for the 2024-2025 School tax year and continue until such time the Board of Education takes such action to modify, amend or repeal this Resolution and the provisions herein or until such time the New York State Legislature takes such action to modify, amend, or repeal Section 466-a of the Real Property Tax Law.

# Ms. Ben-Levy moved, seconded by Mr. Levine carried by a vote of 5-0, (Messrs. Dubner and Minsky absent) to accept the Quarterly Reports for April – June 2023 and July – September 2023.

Shari Diamond, Partner, Cerini & Associates, LLP presented an overview of the Claims Audit reports the fourth quarter of the school year, April to June 2023 and first quarter July to September 2023.

The auditors reviewed 1,580 claims from the fourth quarter from the General, Custodial (Trust & Agency), School Lunch, Federal, and Capital Funds payments. These quarters showed an overall incident percentage of .25%, which included three (3) confirming purchase orders noted by the district and one (1) Purchase Order increased after invoice date.

Ms. Diamond reviewed the audit summary for Fiscal 2023. The district continues to have an extremely low incident percentage rate.

The auditors reviewed 1125 claims from the first quarter from the General, Custodial (Trust & Agency), School Lunch, Federal, and Capital Funds payments. These

quarters showed an overall incident percentage of .53%, which included six (6) confirming purchase orders – signed by the district.

Ms. Diamond reiterated the excellent communication the auditors have with the District which maintains the high level of internal controls.

#### **Board President's Comments**

Ms. Ben-Levy attended the High School's Royal Crown Players production of *the Twelfth Night.* She spoke of the student's "creative and innovative way" of presenting 400 year old literature with a "modern, clever twist." She commented on the interdisciplinary approach of the High School and Middle school faculty working together on this production. She strongly recommended all members of the Board to attend a performance this weekend.

Ms. Ben-Levy wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving and expressed her gratitude for her fellow Board Members, Central Administration and members of the Roslyn staff.

#### Superintendent's Comments

Ms. Brown attended the play this afternoon and commented on the excellence of the show. She spoke of the talent of the students and staff and how thrilled the English department was that *the Twelfth Night* was presented.

She announced the first broadcasting of RTV will be presented tomorrow on 8:00 a.m. during homeroom.

In the spirit of thanksgiving, Ms. Brown thanked the Board of Education, Staff, Administration and the students for all that they do.

#### Student Delegate's Comments

Mr. Sohmer updated the Board of Education on the following:

- He announced that first quarter of the school year has "flown by" and the students are 25% done with the 23-24 school year.
- The OCC held their Inaugural Halloween Trick or Treat adventure. Approximately 350 attended the event at the High School.
- The OCC hosted the Class of 1973 with tours of the High School. The alumni could not believe all the changes to the High School.
- RCP performance of the Twelfth Night is being presented this weekend.
- Fall sports 3 teams advanced to the playoffs; the boys and girls varsity

volleyball and the boys' varsity soccer team. Tryouts for winter sports began on Monday, November 13..

- Monday, November 20<sup>th</sup>, the OCC will hold their annual Thanksgiving pie eating contest.
- Tuesday, November 21 the High School will hold their annual Alumni brunch. Students in their first year of college come back and share with the senior class their experiences at college so far.
- RTV will present their first broadcast tomorrow from the newly installed media broadcasting classroom and studio.

On behalf of the student body, Mr. Sohmer expressed his gratitude to the Board of Education and Central Administration for everything they do for the students.
