Citations: <u>YOU MUST CITE</u> all of the sources you use, including **direct quotes, paraphrases**, or if you incorporate an **author's idea** into your paper. You must also cite **images**, and **video** and **audio** clips. You will use MLA format. You may use citation generators such as <u>NoodleTools</u> or <u>EasyBib</u>, or you may type it yourself using an MLA guide. All of the DATABASES have citation tools which allow you to copy/paste citations into your paper, or upload them into your citation generator. *IF YOU ARE NOT SURE HOW TO CITE, please come to the library and we will be happy to help you. **For instructions to create a NoodleTools account**, use the "<u>NoodleTools PowerPoint</u>" link on the Library Website.

Subscription Databases

Library databases are searchable, digital collections containing journal and newspaper articles, encyclopedia entries, primary sources, video and audio clips, and images. Use them to gather reliable, vetted information. The databases are only available through the <u>RHS Library</u> or the <u>Bryant Library</u>.

ABC-CLIO - World History: Ancient and Medieval Eras ABC OCLIO

Explores ancient civilizations, dynasties, and empires and profiles city-states, countries, and regions of the ancient and medieval world.
