- 1. How would your friends describe you? List 3 adjectives and give a recent example of each.
- 2. What course(s) (academic and/or elective) have been the most meaningful (interesting, challenging, exposed you to new information or way of thinking...) to you while in high school and why?
- 3. What is your personal motto and why?
- 4. What are your long-term goals and/or career plans? What steps have you taken so far to pursue those goals/plans?
- 5. Indicate your most meaningful experience/achievement/leadership role in extra-curricular or community service activity.
- 6. How have you changed/grown as an individual since you first entered high school?
- 7. What would you want the admissions office to know about you that they could not learn from your school records and/or college application? Possible topics may include your greatest strengths, most unique characteristics, significant family events, personal obstacles, and how you cope and overcome challenges.

*Instructions*: Please <u>TYPE</u> your responses below. Please provide details as this information will be incorporated into the Counselor's letter of recommendation. Each parent may submit a separate brag sheet, but this is not required.

- 1. List 3 adjectives that describe your child, and provide recent examples of each.
- 2. What makes your child unique? Please provide a specific example(s).
- 3. If you were writing your child's recommendation letter, what key elements would you include? Please provide examples.
- 4. Are there any unusual circumstances that may have impacted your child's high school experience (negatively or positively)?
- 5. If your child has an active IEP, 504 Plan, or extenuating circumstance, please indicate if you would like your counselor to disclose this information to colleges as a way to provide context for your child's academic performance. This can be discussed further at your Junior Conference.
