Name of Course: European History Advanced Placement

GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF COURSE

The aim of this course is to build on the students' knowledge of the factual narrative of history:

- A. an understanding of some of the principal themes in modern European history;
- B. an awareness of some of the consequences of European contacts with other areas of the world, and
- C. an ability to analyze historical interpretations and primary sources.

The chronological period begins with the high Renaissance and concludes with the 1970's. After the **Advanced Placement Exam** in mid-May, the course will concentrate on preparing the students for the Global Studies Regents. A discussion of values is integrated throughout.
