NAME OF COURSE: GLOBAL HISTORY II - ANALYSIS (HONORS)

GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF COURSE

This course is an elective for students who are academically highly-motivated and seeking an academic challenge. This Analysis Course is designed to complete the two year sequence in Global History with greater emphasis on interpretation, research skills, political change, economic theories, and the inter-relationships of global affairs. Clearly, the values inherent in any discussion of multi-cultural education will play an integral role in this course.

MAJOR TOPICS COVERED

History of the Modern World, 1700-Present, emphasizing both western and non-western cultures.

TEXTBOOKS

World History: Patterns of Interaction, McDougal Little, 2009

In addition, students will be assigned: primary sources; interpretive essays and supplemental textbooks and online research.

GRADING PROCEDURES

Students will be graded according to the established school policy by numerical grades. Grades will be based on test grades and the participation in the total classroom experience. At the completion of the course, students are required to take a Regents Examination in Global Studies. This exam is a two-year sequential regents based on the 9th and 10th grades. A variety of performance assessments will be used throughout the year. The Roslyn High School grading policy is fully in effect.
