

# GLOBAL HISTORY 9 and 10

Department: Social Studies/Special Education

## General Description of Course:

This is a Subject Specific 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade course in Social Studies called Global History. The course is designed to give students an overview of the events that have shaped history of the world from the Age of Revolutions through The Twentieth Century. The goals of the course include focusing on key facts, themes, and concepts that the students need to know to succeed on the Regents Examination in global history and geography. The history of the United States is not included in this course. The class is called Global History 9/10 and has been modified to meet the needs of the students. The ultimate goal for the 10<sup>th</sup> grade students in this class is to pass the NYS regents exam in Global Studies and for the 9<sup>th</sup> grade students to improve their test taking skills and become educated in the 10<sup>th</sup> grade curriculum.
