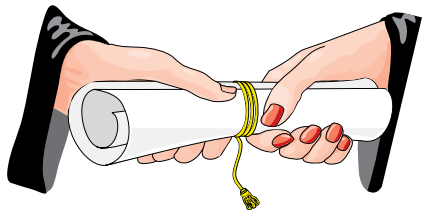


Welcome to Roslyn High School Graduation!

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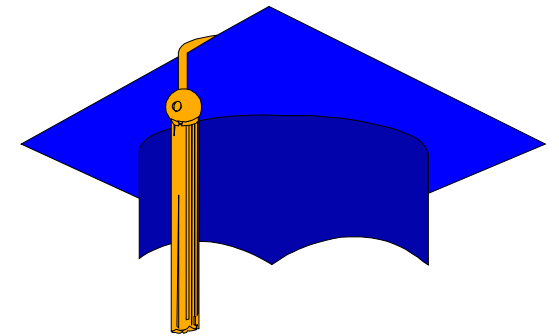

Information for graduates and their families

June 2019

When and where is graduation?

Friday, June 21, 2019 at 3:00pm at the Tilles Center at LIU Post.

Is transportation provided to the Tilles Center?

Bus transportation is available from the circle at Roslyn High School to the Tilles Center. There is continuous bus service leaving the high school beginning at 1:45pm.

Is parking available at the Tilles Center?

There is ample parking at the Tilles Center for all guests attending graduation. Handicap spaces are available and the Tilles Center is handicap accessible.

How many tickets are available to each graduate?

Each student will be given four tickets to graduation. There are no reserved seats. The Tilles Center staff will comfortably accommodate the graduates, parents, family members and guests of Roslyn High School.

Will there be an official photographer at the graduation ceremony?

Roslyn High School arranges for a professional photographer and videographer. The video of graduation is available for purchase. Graduates will receive information in the mail concerning the purchase of video and/or the purchase of additional pictures.

Can I take my own photographs and video?

Personal photography and videos are permitted. However, the Tilles Center only allows photography and/or video to be taken from the seats. Tripods are prohibited. For the safety and comfort of all our guests, parents and all family members must remain in their seats throughout the ceremony.



Which students speak at graduation?

The OCC president, valedictorian and salutatorian will speak at graduation. Prior to the ceremony, these students meet with administrators to review the content and delivery of their speeches.

What are the students' responsibilities for the ceremony?

All students must attend graduation rehearsal on Wednesday, June 19 at 10:15am. Students should arrive, on time, at the high school where they will be transported by bus to the Tilles Center. At the rehearsal, students will receive detailed instructions about graduation procedures, as well as their tickets and caps and gowns. Procedural information is also mailed home. Included in this information are requirements for dress, arrival times and decorum. As always, students will be expected to conduct themselves in a respectful and dignified manner.

Senior Walk

On their way back from rehearsal, and in their caps and gowns, students will take part in the traditional Senior Walk at the East Hills and Harbor Hill schools (whichever school they attended), where they will receive a warm welcome from students and staff.

What are the responsibilities of the audience at graduation?

In keeping with the formality of this occasion, we also anticipate that the audience will behave in a respectful and dignified manner. If it is necessary for infants and young children to attend, please be courteous and leave the auditorium with them if their behavior is disruptive. To ensure that we maintain the dignity of the ceremony, we ask everyone to turn off all cell phones and beepers.

The Tilles Center provides ushers for our guests' safety and comfort. It is important that the entire audience follow their directions. Guests are expected to remain in their seats and out of the aisles throughout the ceremony.

When will diplomas be distributed?

Beginning Friday, June 28, graduates may pick up their diplomas at the Roslyn High School Attendance Office between the hours of 9:00am and 2:00pm. All school obligations (return of textbooks, uniforms, iPads, etc.) must be met before students will receive diplomas.
