Ms. Shari Diamond, Partner, Internal Audit, Cerini & Associates, LLP presented an overview of the Audit reports for January 2019 through March 2019.

The auditors reviewed 1,296 claims from the General, Trust & Agency, School Lunch, Federal, and Capital Funds. This quarter showed an overall incident percentage of .31%, which included one finding and three other matters. The claims were flagged for informational purposes, which included: sales tax included in a check and confirming purchase orders – signed by District. Ms. Diamond commented on the proactive measures implemented by the Business Office as they continue to educate the staff on the district purchasing policies and has led to a very low error rate. Once again, she commended the Business Office for their continued communication with the auditors concerning any claim related questions prior to processing the claim.
