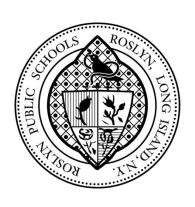

#### **A Historical Perspective**

**2017–2018:** \$2,434,051.00

**▶** 2018–2019: \$2,637,658.00

**2019–2020:** \$3,056,558.00

Year-to-year change: +\$418,900

Total received in 18/19 for tuition paying students = \$2,160,008.50 (not including Hilltop Academy)

#### Escalating Costs for Special Education

- The latest annual financial survey by the Council of School Superintendents, "increasing cost of special education" was cited as a significant issue by 56% superintendents statewide-more than any other expense-related issue.
  - There are growing needs among schoolchildren, many related to mental health issues.
  - Improving mental health services in Roslyn has been a priority in our budget over the last number of years and will continue.
  - Our goal is to assure educational opportunities for students with disabilities while enabling our district to support and manage the cost of providing those services.
